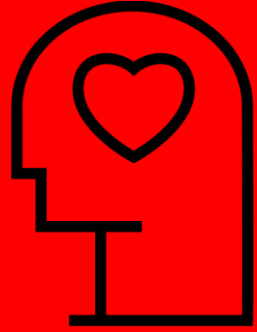

Engage – Videos from class teachers are shared on Class Dojo. Daily and weekly timetables are uploaded and included in Home Learning Packs available for collection

Support – Throughout the week. Children and parents have access to staff via Class Dojo/emails/phone calls

Celebration – Friday. Teachers use videos to finish the week and review/celebrate work.

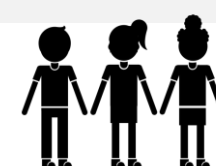
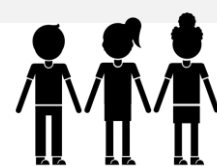
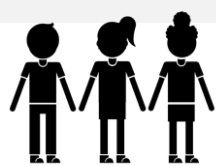
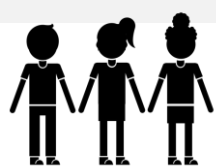
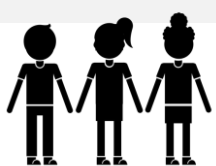
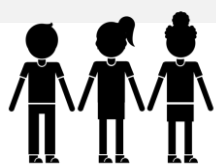
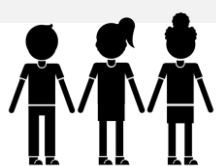
Remote Learning Plan

Monday

- A weekly timetable with an overview of learning for the week shared with parents via Class Dojo and is included in physical learning packs
- Physical learning packs are available for collection from the school playground
- Previous week's learning pack are handed back to school for marking and feedback

Daily

- Teachers record a video every day to outline the focus of learning
- Daily timetables are uploaded to Class Dojo to ensure that the learning intention is clear and children know how to organise their time
- Activities are uploaded to Class Dojo for children to complete digitally
- Teaching videos created by class teachers and/ or links to other websites (e.g. Oak National Academy) are uploaded to Class Dojo to support with learning
- Uploaded work receives feedback promptly ensuring that children can amend work, make improvements and challenge their learning further
- Common misconceptions and errors are identified and focussed feedback sessions are provided when necessary, at least weekly
- Children receive positive feedback praising effort, achievement and commitment to learning
- Daily lessons are provided in English (reading and writing including phonics for EYFS and KS1 children), Maths, foundation subjects and keeping skills sharp. For children in EYFS, there are focused activities linked to learning through play and the EYFS curriculum
- Parents/ children upload work via Class Dojo to the teacher
- SEND children are set specific learning challenges from support staff who normally support children including speech therapy and SSSEN
- Children are read to by staff regularly throughout the week
- Children are asked to record sessions of them reading a book and sending it via Class Dojo. Where this isn't possible, children read to staff over the telephone. We are exploring the option of a virtual reading session

Remote Learning Plan

Tuesday

- Fareshare and Magic Breakfast is available for families to come and collect from school, free of charge. For families in isolation or unable to get to the school grounds, staff deliver food. Families in need are encouraged to communicate their needs with school and where possible, we work in partnership with local charities to support

Wednesday Afternoon

- To encourage the children to have an afternoon of learning away from a digital device, children participate in wellbeing Wednesday. A timetable of suggested activities is sent home to families.

Friday

- Class teacher record a video at the end of the week to celebrate achievements and finish with reading a story to the class.
- Head of Academy records a Star of the Week assembly sharing achievements of children throughout school both in the virtual and physical school

Free School Meals

- Free school meals are currently provided by Caterlink. The meals are packed into a fortnightly hamper with a suggested menu and cooking instructions. These hampers are to be collected from the school playground, where families are unable to collect, staff deliver.

Digital Devices and the internet

- Children without suitable devices have been identified and provided with a loaned device.
- All families have received a free Sim card from Vodaphone with 40gb of internet
- Free internet via BT Hotspot has been provided until July

Throughout the week, staff make regular phone calls to all children and families. Arrangements have been made with some families for calls to be made daily. During the phone calls, staff ask questions about wellbeing, health, learning, support that might be needed and follow up with children and families who are not fully engaging with remote learning.
