


Subject: History

Cycle: A

Past and Present

Talk about the lives of the people around them and their roles in society. Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class; Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling.



Famous Explorers: Where have humans explored?

Introduction to different explorers looking at explorers that explore different parts of the world. Famous explorers from the past meeting Charles Darwin, Neil Armstrong, Ibn Battuta, Roald Amundsen, Sylvia Earle and Edmund Hilary. Consider modern day explorers.



Famous Explorers



Toys: How have children's toys changed since our older relatives were little??

Changes to toys over the last 60 years looking at modern day then going back a little further in time. Compare and use evidence to draw conclusions.



The Great Fire of London: What happened to London during the fire of 1666?

Discover what London was like in 1666. Make simple comparison between then and the present day. Discover what happened on the night of 2nd Sept 1666 and learn about key individuals



Ancient Egypt: What were the greatest achievements of the Ancient Egyptians?

Early civilization within Egypt discovering how the upper and lower Kingdom joined together. Compare the Egyptian time period to Neolithic in Britain



Crime and Punishment: How has crime and punishment changed over time in Britain?

Build on knowledge of periods in history that have been studied in KS2. Explore different historical disciplinary concepts, how crime and punishment has changed over time in Britain. The development of the police force from the Victorian period right through to the new millennium

Anglo Saxons and the Vikings: How did England change during the settlement of the Anglo Saxons and Vikings?

Achievements from 410CE to 1066CE. Life in England after the fall of the Roman Empire and the reasons why the Anglo-Saxons travelled to England. Study the Vikings – who were they, why they carried out raids and how their arrival impacted the political and social hierarchy.



The Romans: How did the Roman Empire impact Britain?



Explore Roman's and their achievements from 43CE to 410CE. Explore what life was like, who was in charge and held power in Europe. Study the Roman invasion of Britain and the final years of the empire and the events that led to its downfall.

Kings, Queens and Castles: Where did Kings and Queens live through time?

Introduction to some of the most famous and significant kings and queens from England from King William I in 1066 to King Charles III in the present day. Find out about their lives and which palaces and castles were special to them

Technology: How has technology changed our lives over the last 60 years?

Think about what the term the technology means. Consider the technology used in every day life. Compare technology from the past to modern day. Think about historical figures e.g. Tim Berners-Lee and the impact his inventions had.

Hospitals and Healthcare: How did Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell help to improve hospitals

Changes in hospital and healthcare over the years and the significant people involved focussing on Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell.

Stone Age: How did daily life change in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age

Visit Creswell Craggs, learn about prehistory in Britain and how we find out about prehistory. Discover what life was like from the Stone Age through to the Iron Age

World War Two: Why was the Battle of Britain a significant turning point for the United Kingdom in World War Two?

Gain a wider understanding of how World War Two began looking at how concepts such as empire and rebellion have influenced Hitler and his plan to dominate Europe. Explore the significance of the Battle of Britain.

Ancient Maya: What similarities and differences are there between the Maya civilisation and England from the 8th to the 10th century?

Explore who the Maya people were, when and where in the world they lived and the reasons why they were so successful, particularly in the classic period.

Ancient Greece: What were the greatest achievements of the Ancient Greeks?

Study the achievements of the Ancient Greeks from around 3000 BCE to the reign of Alexander the Great around 330 BCE
